Learn how Marjorie Post celebrated the holidays

Marjorie Merriweather Post often spent the holiday season at Mar-A-Lago. Photographs in Hillwood's archives document holiday decorations at Mar-A-Lago, Palm Beach and Tregaron, Washington D.C. in the 1940s, as well as at the American Embassy in Brussels, Belgium in 1938. Post also documented the décor on board the *Sea Cloud* in 1947, her "first Christmas on the ship" as she wrote in her scrapbook. Exhibition Closing Dates: January 9, 2022

Please note *Roaring Twenties: The Life and Style of Marjorie Merriweather Post* and *Kristine Mays: Rich Soil* close to the public on January 9, 2022.

Upcoming Closure: January 10-31, 2022

Hillwood will close to the public from January 10-31 to clean and keep the mansion maintained to the pristine standards for which it is known. Hillwood will reopen to the public on Tuesday, February 1.

Virtual Volunteer Business Meeting: January 27, 2022 (10 a.m.)

Hillwood's annual Volunteer Business Meeting will be offered virtually via Zoom on **Thursday**, **January 27, 2022 (10 a.m.)**. The meeting will provide volunteers with the opportunity to learn about Hillwood's strategic plan, important updates, and major projects for the year ahead. The meeting is scheduled to run about 1 hour and 20 minutes and will include time for volunteers to submit questions via the Q&A feature.

All volunteers are encouraged to attend and no advance registration is needed. A Zoom link with the meeting instructions will be emailed closer to the program date. The business meeting will be recorded and the video link shared via email and posted on the volunteer website.

Upcoming Exhibition: February 19, 2022

Hillwood's new exhibition *The Luxury of Clay: Porcelain Past and Present*, on view in the Dacha, opens to the public on February 19, 2022. Hillwood founder Marjorie Merriweather Post valued porcelain objects for their beauty, exquisite design, and historic associations. While most were crafted for specific uses, these items are valued objects in their own right. Featuring more than 125 objects, the exhibition will trace the remarkable development of porcelain, from its origins in 9th-century China to its discovery in Europe in the early 18th century, leading to contemporary artistic interpretations of this material.

2022 Volunteer Continuing Education

Hillwood's volunteer management team is planning continuing education for volunteers in 2022, including new research currently being conducted by staff on Hillwood's history and the societal norms during Marjorie Post's life. Additional information is forthcoming.

A friendly reminder that Hillwood's winter coat drive in partnership with One Warm Coat is running now through Thursday, December 16. Hillwood will collect and deliver donated items to Thrive DC, whose mission is to prevent and end homelessness in DC. All volunteers are invited to make a difference in our local community by donating to the drive.

Collection Sites

We are collecting new and gently used winter coats, scarves, winter hats, and gloves. The collection sites will be unattended. There will be paper receipts available at each location site for volunteers to fill out. There will be three collection sites on the estate:

- Volunteer lounge, located on the second floor of the mansion
- Administration building, just inside the main entrance to the left
- Greenhouse horticulture offices, just inside the office doors across from the breakroom on the lower level

Daily, 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. The drive begins November 16 at 9 a.m. and ends December 16 at 12 p.m.
