Hillwood is pleased to announce the return of the Volunteer Appreciation Reception. Join your fellow volunteers and Hillwood staff for a spring reception in your honor on **Monday**, **May 16** from **5-7 p.m.** The event will take place in-person under the C.W. Post center tent. THE LUXURY OF CLAY: PORCELAIN PAST AND PRESENT

Featuring approximately 140 objects in the dacha and special displays in the mansion, *The Luxury of Clay: Porcelain Past and Present* traces the development of hard-paste porcelain in Western Europe with examples from Meissen (Saxony), Du Paquier (Vienna), and KPM (Berlin), as well as a selection of Russian and French porcelain from Hillwood's permanent collection, further illustrating the influence of Western European designs on Russian porcelain manufactories.

New acquisitions and select loans from private and public collections in New York and Washington, D.C. complement the show. Select examples of contemporary ceramics, including works by Cindy Sherman (b. 1954), Bouke de Vries (b. 1960), Chris Antemann (b. 1971), and Roberto Lugo (b. 1981), demonstrate the historic inspiration of Chinese, German, and French porcelain used by ceramicists today. Linked below is a brief overview, which will highlight a few notable contemporary juxtapositions, in both the dacha and mansion, while illustrating new acquisitions and special loans that have been reunited with pieces from Hillwood's collection for the first time.
