JANUARY CLOSURE

Hillwood closed to the public on Monday, January 9 for our annual deep-clean of the mansion and to update our exhibition spaces and will be closed until Friday, February 3. Hillwood will re-open to the public on Saturday, February 4.

2022 VISITATION RECAP

In 2022, Hillwood welcomed **98,739 on-site visitors.** This marks our highest attended year, surpassing our previous record of 85,982 visitors in 2017. We also continued to welcome a high number of virtual guests, with a total virtual attendance of 5,446. Thank you for continuing to support the visitor experience and helping us to remain flexible and responsive throughout the phases of our operations.

UPDATE TO CHAUFFEUSE DISPLAY IN MARJORIE POST'S BEDROOM

With the needs of our guests in mind, the two low chairs that were previously framing the fireplace in Marjorie Post's bedroom (catalog numbers 31.86 and 31.87) have been moved to sit directly beneath the windows on the far side of the room. Adjusting the placement of these chairs will allow guests to still be able to view them while also allowing more flexibility and space for guests to walk in the accessible portion of the room

This special exhibition will explore the innovating and intrepid collectors, artists, and designers within Hillwood's collection, those who set an example for Post and future women by making a place for themselves and overcoming obstacles through their determination to succeed.

UPSTANDER TRAINING

As ambassadors of Hillwood, our collective goal for volunteers and staff is to provide the best possible visitor experience. A frequent question often asked is how do we balance the culture of gracious hospitality while also standing up for ourselves or others if someone is disrespectful or oversteps boundaries? The below pre-recorded training video and handout were developed as a first step in helping equip volunteers and staff better balance being gracious in a difficult situation. These training resources aim to educate and build a foundation of understanding on DEAI, recognize bias in the workplace, and empower volunteers and staff to take proper steps for responding to those moments across campus. The training is rooted in the key component of Hillwood's mission, core values, and graciousness that Marjorie Post extended to all she welcomed to Hillwood.

Bird counts play an integral role in bird conservation and research including species management, habitat protection, and informing law and policy.
