JANUARY 2024 CLOSURE

Hillwood will be open through Sunday, January 14, 2024. The museum will close to the public from Monday, January 15 to Friday, February 2 for a deep-clean of the mansion and to update our exhibition spaces. Hillwood will re-open to the public on Saturday, February 3.

VOLUNTEER LOUNGE UPDATE

Hillwood recently completed the construction of the new volunteer lounge in the Butler's House and will be furnishing the space, as well as adding finishing touches, during Hillwood's closure in January. We are anticipating the new space will be ready for volunteers in February 2024. Please note that we will announce the exact move-in date once the new volunteer lounge is open. We are excited to welcome volunteers into the updated space in the Butler's House, which will be more accessible and inclusive for all.

With this move, the volunteer lounge in the mansion will temporarily be used as storage and staging for our collections department. Eventually, it will be transformed into public gallery space, allowing us to showcase more of the collection and expand the Marjorie Post story.

We understand that many volunteers have fond memories associated with the old lounge, and we appreciate your patience and support as we prepare these new spaces and embark on an exciting new phase for Hillwood.

Mansion Room Closures

Recent Conservation

L'amour folie or "love folly" was painted by Jean-Honoré Fragonard (1732-1806), a defining French artist of the rococo style during the reign of Louis XV. Set amidst rosebushes and rose-hued clouds, Cupid wields a jester's staff while pairs of doves fly overhead and perch on the ground. The painting underwent meticulous cleaning and restoration by Maryland Art Conservation, revealing the full effects of Fragonard's dreamlike pastel palette and soft, luminous light. Acquired by Marjorie Post in 1951, this work is on view in her bedroom.

HILLWOOD AT THE WASHINGTON WINTER SHOW

From January 12-14, 2024, Hillwood will be part of the ever-popular Washington Winter Show with a special exhibition of *Splendor & Surprise*.

The selection of pieces from Hillwood's collection on display at the 2024 Washington Winter Show embodies Post's taste in porcelain, tableware, silver, gemstones, fashion, and flower-themed designs. It also highlights some of Post's lesser-known interests. That most of the objects chosen are held in storage is indicative of the collection's depth and diversity, which are further mirrored in Hillwood's wide-ranging cultural programs, special exhibitions, and changing displays. The items also speak to the generosity of Post family members and other donors who have supported the ongoing expansion of the collection.

2024 GARDEN DOCENT TRAINING

The new year kicked off with the start of Hillwood's 2024 garden docent training program. We are thrilled to welcome the docents-in-training to Hillwood's volunteer team and look forward to working with them for the next few months.

With staff presenting their areas of expertise, the garden docent training is a wonderful opportunity for volunteers to take advantage of these sessions as continuing education and enrichment. For newer volunteers, these lectures and their attendant readings will be good introductions to Hillwood's interpretive messages and garden collections. For seasoned volunteers, the lectures and readings will be good refreshers that may also reveal interesting new angles and research. A new, virtual approach

will be offered this year, allowing volunteers to attend from the comfort of their homes. Some lectures will be pre-recorded and shared via the volunteer website. Other lectures will be hosted live via Zoom.
