## **Inquiry Activity: Japanese-style Garden**

- 1. (Hook, open, divergent) Pretend you are at the top of this garden. What's the first thing that comes to your mind if you were standing at the top looking at the garden?
- 2. Go down to the bottom. Look for surprises. (closed, cognitive-memory) **What is the first thing** that came into your view as you traveled down?
- 3. This garden has a very different look and atmosphere from the French garden. (closed, cognitive-memory) **What kind of a garden is this?**
- 4. (closed, cognitive-memory) **Have you been to other gardens like this? Japanese-style gardens or Japanese?**
- 5. (closed, convergent) On first viewing, how is this garden different from others you've explored like the French parterre or motor court?
- 6. (closed, cognitive-memory) What materials or elements of design do you see in the garden? How are they used?
- 7. (closed, convergent) How is the upper garden different from the lower garden?
- 8. (open, divergent) Where would you like to spend time in this garden? Why?
- 9. (open, divergent) Why would someone have a garden like this?
- 10. (open, divergent) What does this garden tell us about Marjorie Post?
- 11. Hillwood did an extensive renovation of this garden more than 20 years ago—at tremendous cost and human effort. (open, divergent) Why would a museum do this? What does this garden tell us about Hillwood Estate, Museum & Gardens?

## Inquiry Activity: Compare and Contrast the Japanese-style Garden and French Parterre

- 1. How are these gardens alike and different? Compare and contrast.
- 2. What is each garden's relationship to Post: her taste and style and usage?
- 3. How are their design & features alike and different?
- 4. What do we know about each garden's relationship to the museum today?
