### 2024 Summer Seasonal Display Design Overview

Spring always seems fleeting, and it will be time to install the summer seasonal display before we know it. The color palatte this year will be similar to spring, heavy on pinks and purples throughout the grounds, especially along the corridor between the conservatory and the café. A few different shades of sunpatiens will offer bright colors throughout this area while trailing lanatana and scavaelos will provide up-close interest. The Lunar Lawn seasonal beds will lend a different look with oranges and blues as a nod to the exhibition *Fragile Beauty: Art of the Ocean*. A sea of blue salvia will be broken up with punches of orange cannas, zinnias and marigolds. The seasonal beds there will be topped off with a border of orange sunpatiens. Pinks and reds will also be carried up from the motor court to the Friendship Walk. A very low ground cover of vinca with pink flowers starts off around Eros providing distinct layers of annual flowers, ivy and boxwood. In the French parterre and rose garden, a more traditional planting of begonias will be on view. Along the Friendship Walk, small pink and white zinnias will light up the path.

There are a few more thoughts behind the designs to share with you. Last year, Hillwood was recognized as having hummingbirds on the property very late into the season. This year we wanted to make sure to support these feathered friends by continuing to plant some of their favorite food sources like salvias, cupheas, and cannas. Of course, we always love adding interesting plants to the garden. This year sees the return of Ruellia 'Purple Showers', the Mexican petunia, to the cutting garden wall. This annual grows quickly, reaching four to five feet tall in a single summer. Ruellia produces an impressive non-stop succession of lovely purple flowers that only last one day. Finally, we will share that we are planting some of the smaller containers in a different way. Instead of using a number of smaller plants in each one, we will be planting one large plant. This will be evident in the planters at the pavilion patio where one large Dipladenia will be showcased in each. The Butler's House planters will have two large foxtail ferns with coleus and the containers near the administration building will have a large spider plant with a bit of tradescantia.

#### **Additional Items to Note:**

- Installation of the summer display starts April 29 and we anticipate it to stay in until the third week of September.
- There are 10,560 plants in this display. The greenhouses were responsible for growing and maintaining 2,772 of those plants.

(Pictures start from left to right in order of appearance in the text)

Outside conservatory	The main structural elements of the containers will begin with a pink hibiscus, Panicum 'Northwind', Pennisetum 'Fireworks' or Cordyline 'Maria'. Filler plants will include 'Oriole' Swiss chard, Gomphrena 'Pinata', Angelonia 'Angelmist Spreading Pink', Begonia 'Dragonwing Pink', Pentas 'Lucky Star Pink', 'Compact Hot Pink' sunpatiens, and Coleus 'Wild Lime'. Trailing elements such as Ipomoea (sweet potato vine) 'Floramia Rosso', Carex 'Everillo', 'Needlepoint' ivy, Spilanthes 'Lemon Drops', Lysimachia 'Goldilocks' and Scaevola 'Fashion Pink' will also be feaured.	
Motor court	'Cora Cascade Strawberry' vinca in the center bed around Eros and 'Cora XDR Punch' vinca along the curb edge. A section of 'French Quarter' coleus along the sitting area wall will provide added interest.	

Motor court containers	All the containers will feature 'Cora XDR Punch' vinca. In the square planters, it will be paired with Pennisetum 'Fireworks'. The crape myrtle pots will see it mixed with tropicals like Sansevieria 'Moonshine', Kimberley queen fern (Nephrolepis obliterata) and Tillandsia augmented with Plectranthus 'Mona Lavender' and 'Microbaze Spitfire' coleus. Artemesia 'Silver Brocade' left in from last year will provide a trailing element with 'Needlepoint' ivy.	
Porte cochere	Some plants of note in the tropical display will be the fiddle leaf fig, Schefflera, Dracaena, and Alocasia 'California'. These will act as a backdrop to planters containing Begonia 'Solenia Light Pink' left in from the spring, Impatiens 'Glimmer Appleblossom', Hypoestes 'Splash Select Pink', Plectranthus 'Mona Lavender', Heuchera 'Carnival Rose Granita' and Tradescantia zebrina.	
Pavilion	Red Dipladenia	
French parterre	Begonia 'BabyWing Pink' and Begonia 'BabyWing Red' around the edges and Caladium 'Carolyn Whorton' around the statue of Diana.	
Rose garden	The center bed and annual strips will be full of Begonia 'Babywing Pink'. Angelonia 'Angelmist White' will also be added to the strips. The rose beds will be edged with Alyssum 'White Stream'. Scarlet runner bean will also be added.

Friendship walk	Zinnia 'Profusion Cherry Bicolor' in the sunnier areas and Impatiens 'Beacon Portland Mix' in shadier spots.	
Putting green	For the containers, a Kimberly queen fern for height, Angelonia 'Archangel Cherry Red' for filler, and Lantana 'New Gold' as the trailing element. This same combination will be featured in the beds with Coleus 'Ruby Slippers'.	
Lunar	The back row will contain groupings of Salvia 'Black and Blue', crotons, Salvia 'Mystic Spires Blue', Zinnia 'Benary's Giant Dahlia BluePoint Series Orange', Canna 'Pretoria', and Marigold 'Xochi Orange'. The front border will be a massing of 'Compact Electric Orange' sunpatiens.	
South portico	Beds will be a mix of Salvia 'Black and Blue', orange cuphea, and 'Tattoo Orange' vinca.	
Vista planters	'Tattoo Orange' vinca and Calibrachoa 'Aloha Kona Hot Orange' surrounding orange cuphea with Muehlenbeckia (wire vine) as the trailer.	
Around the Dacha	Beds of Evolvulus 'Blue Daze'.

Holly walk	Pockets of foxtail fern (Asparagus densiflorus 'Myersii'), Begonia 'Gryphon', 'Compact Electric Orange' sunpatiens, Strobilanthes, and 'Kong Salmon Pink' coleus.	
Security	A mix of Angelonia 'Angelmist White', Impatiens 'Beacon Rose', Coleus 'Black Dragon', Hypoestes 'Splash Select Pink' and Plectranthus 'Mona Lavender'.	
Butler's house pots	Foxtail fern (Asparagus densiflorus 'Myersii') and 'Microbaze Spitfire' coleus	
Butler's bed	Salvia 'Love and Wishes', Angelonia 'Angelface Super White', strobilanthes, Gomphrena 'Pinball Purple', Dahlia 'Happy Days Purple', and Pentas 'Lucky Star Violet' will be added to the existing planting.	
Cutting garden wall	This design will be arranged into two groupings of plants that are repeated down the wall divided by foxtail fern (Asparagus densiflorus 'Myersii'). The first group will contain Colocasia 'Black Magic' with 'Compact Lilac' sunpatiens. The second group will be Ruellia 'Purple Showers' surrounded by Euphorbia 'Breathless White' and a edge of Tradescantia pallida 'Purple Heart'.	

#### Greenhouse bed

Taller elements will include Colocasia 'Black Magic', Salvia 'Kisses and Wishes', and Angelonia 'Angelface Super Blue'. Swaths of 'Compact Lilac' sunpatiens will be offset with patches of Gomphrena 'QIS Purple', strobilanthes, and Euphorbia 'Breathless White'. Scaevola 'Blue Brilliance' and Tradescantia pallida 'Purple Heart' will act as edging plants.
