# EXPLORING SELECT OBJECTS WITH POLISH ORIGINS IN HILLWOOD'S **COLLECTION**

Deputy Director and Chief Curator Wilfried Zeisler recently traveled to Poland, visiting numerous museums and castles that provided further insights into Hillwood's collection. Marjorie Merriweather Post visited Poland twice in 1937 and 1938, before the country was ravaged by the Second World War. Through her European travels and connections, Post acquired several objects with Polish origins. ## MONUMENT AND PORPHYRY URN IN THE ROSE GARDEN

Hillwood's collections staff recently observed a black discharge coming from the porphyry urn, which has caused staining on the monument. To prevent further damage, the porphyry urn has been temporarily removed. The collections team is currently assessing the stains on the monument and will determine the best course of action for cleaning, which may involve consultation with an outdoor sculpture conservator. We'll keep volunteers updated on the progress, including when the monument cleaning will take place. A big thank you to the collections staff for their swift action in protecting the garden's treasured pieces. And thank you to all of you for your flexibility as we address these repairs.
