Hillwood Resources available to Volunteers

Hillwood offers a variety of continuing education and resources to volunteers that focus on our founder Marjorie Merriweather Post, the art collections, gardens, and more.

Volunteer Continuing Education

Details for upcoming continuing education can be found in Hillwood's volunteer monthly newsletter and posted on the volunteer website (volunteer.hillwoodmuseum.org). Most volunteer lectures are offered virtually via Zoom. A webinar link is emailed in advance of the lecture.

Virtual Volunteer Business Meeting

The volunteer business meeting, held every January or February, is a wonderful opportunity to hear from the senior management team regarding Hillwood's strategic plan and each department's objectives for the year ahead. Curator-led Lectures

Curator-led lectures are offered to volunteers in conjunction with Hillwood's temporary exhibitions. The lectures associated with a docent training program are also available to active volunteers and staff members. Online Collection Database

Explore nearly 20,000 objects from Hillwood's collection of Russian imperial art, French eighteenth-century decorative art, and Marjorie Merriweather Post's personal collection of apparel, jewelry, and accessories.

The online collection is a work in progress and many of the records are not accompanied with an image or title and do not necessarily reflect complete or current knowledge about the objects. How to Access: The collection database is accessible on Hillwood's main website at www.hillwoodmusuem.org, located towards the bottom of the home page, and on the volunteer website under "Helpful Links," and at the bottom of the homepage.

Volunteer Lounge & Library

The volunteer lounge, located in the Butler's House, features a non-lending volunteer reference library with over 550 titles. This collection reflects the museum's collection of imperial Russian, 18th-century French decorative arts, and gardens, offering valuable resources for further learning.

Archives & Special Collections

Archives and Special Collections (ASC) consists of a 25,000+ volume research library, the contents of both mansion libraries, and archival collections covering Marjorie Merriweather Post, Hillwood as a residence, and the operations of Hillwood Estate, Museum and Gardens. Its research library contains approximately 38,000 items that consist primarily of monographs, auction catalogs, rare antiquarian materials, Marjorie Merriweather Post's personal book collections, periodicals, and vertical files. The library also provides access to a variety of electronic resources, including select JSTOR and ProQuest research databases and journals. The Hillwood archives preserves invaluable primary and secondary source material on the life of Marjorie Merriweather Post, the creation of Hillwood as a residence, and the works of Hillwood as a museum. Materials from the Hillwood archives are often used for exhibitions, publications, programming, and various external research projects.

Located in the Collections and Research Center, staff and volunteers are welcome to schedule an ASC orientation tour and learn about the wealth of research materials provided as part of their employment and volunteer service. Research visits can also be arranged by appointment, and some materials are available for borrowing. The library and archives are available by appointment to outside scholars, Hillwood members and volunteers, and the general public; please contact (202) 243-3934 or jspeck@hillwoodmuseum.org.
